

## **Vocabulary**

Coast-The land next to the ocean .

<u>Tourism</u>—Travelling or sightseeing.

<u>Dune-</u>A mound or hill of sand built up by the action of wind.

<u>Erosion-</u>The wearing away of the earth's surface by wind or water

Peninsula-A piece of land surrounded on nearly all sides by water. It is connected to a larger body of land by a usually narrow strip of land.
