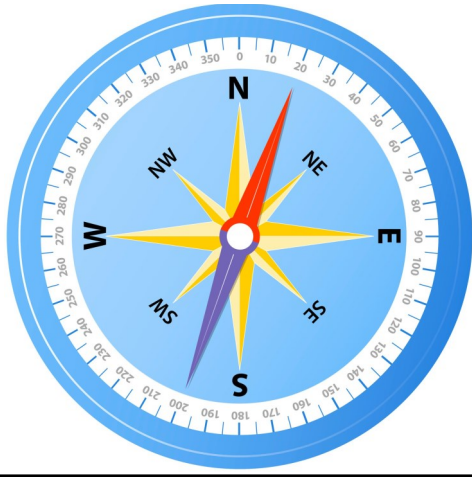


Year Three Geography knowledge organiser– Do we like to be beside the sea?

Vocabulary

Coast-The land next to the ocean .

Tourism– Travelling or sightseeing.

Dune-A mound or hill of sand built up by the action of wind.

Erosion-The wearing away of the earth's surface by wind or water

Peninsula-A piece of land surrounded on nearly all sides by water. It is connected to a larger body of land by a usually narrow strip of land.

Knowledge:

- The British Isles have many coastlines.
- Coastlines have been made from the erosion of land from seas and rivers over time.
- Coasts have different types of rocks, headlands, cliffs, bays, beaches, dunes, marshes and estuaries
