To encourage uptake of sports activities; to widen experiences of different sports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Active playtimes – renewal of equipment • After school sports clubs, including football (on request from boys) • New gymnastics club 	Sports coaches, staff time, playtime equipment £4,000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Active playtimes where children are busy and engaged. • Enthusiastic response to clubs, but mainly boys • A significant number of children go to mosque classes after school and cannot attend clubs. • Need to keep encouraging girls: fewer girls than boys in clubs; 100% Y6 girls enjoy physical activity but of these 62% only "a bit". (100% Y4 girls enjoy physical activity a lot or quite a lot.)
